NAPLAN CONGRATULATIONS



Data Visualisation-

Collect, explore and sort data, and use digital systems to present the data creatively.

Designing algorithms-

Follow, describe and represent a sequence of steps and decisions (algorithms) needed to solve simple problems. Everyday algorithms like how to brush your teeth or tie your shoelaces.

Collaboration & Communication-

Create and organise ideas and information and share these with known people in safe online environments. We looked at how we can support some of the deeper and richer skills that students can gain which will be important for their future careers.

Tomorrow the years 3-6 will take part in the inter school cross country competition at Bald Hill park in Clarinda, parents are very welcome to attend.

Next week the Year 3 and 4 students will be attending camp in the city from Monday to Wednesday. They are very excited and looking forward to visiting many of our landmarks. You can follow our adventures on Twitter and facebook.


